

Autocomplete Wizard | WordPress Plugin

Autocomplete Wizard plugin helps your users find what they are looking for better and faster. No more searching in the dark, no more 404 errors! Autocomplete your content and redirect your users.

The shortcode adds a dropdown SELECT field with automatic redirection, based on user selection. The function does not interfere with the native search form and can be placed anywhere in a post or a page. The plugin works with jQuery1.9+ and 2.0+.

The search form redirects to any chosen post, page, category or tag and does not generate any search pages using GET requests (in other words, the `?s=query` is not possible).

If you are not using the post editor, you can place the shortcode directly inside your PHP template, using this code:

echo do_shortcode('[your-shortcode-here]');

```

Features

- Seamless integration with WordPress styles (the integrated stylesheet works both for light themes and dark themes)
- HTML5 compatible/valid

Installation

1. Upload the **autocomplete-wizard** folder to your `/wp-content/plugins/` directory
2. Activate the plugin via the Plugins menu in WordPress
3. Review the options and set the labels (Settings -> Autocomplete Wizard)
4. Review the shortcodes (Settings -> Autocomplete Wizard)
5. Publish your post or page

Shortcodes

1. Add the `[ac-meta name="email"]` shortcode to display all posts with the same meta value (e.g. "email").
2. Add the `[ac-posts comments="yes"]` shortcode to display all posts and show number of comments.
3. Add the `[ac-posts comments="no"]` shortcode to display all posts and hide number of comments.

4. Add the `[ac-posts category="Adventures"]` shortcode to display all posts in a specific category. (e.g. "Adventures").
5. Add the `[ac-pages comments="yes"]` shortcode to display all pages and show number of comments.
6. Add the `[ac-pages comments="no"]` shortcode to display all pages and hide number of comments.
7. Add the `[ac-all comments="yes"]` shortcode to display all posts and pages and show number of comments.
8. Add the `[ac-all comments="no"]` shortcode to display all posts and pages and hide number of comments.
9. Add the `[ac-categories]` shortcode to display all categories.
10. Add the `[ac-custom type="testimonials"]` shortcode to display all custom post types (e.g. "testimonials").
11. Add the `[ac-taxonomy name="testimonials_category"]` shortcode to display all custom taxonomies (e.g. "testimonials_category").
12. Add the `[ac-tax-posts taxonomyname="testimonials_category" name="business" type="testimonials"]` shortcode to display all custom posts in a specific taxonomy.
13. Add the `[ac-tags]` shortcode to display all tags.
14. Add the `[ac-tagged-posts tag="blog"]` shortcode to display all posts with a specific tag.
